The Competition...

The Best Business Idea Competition (BBIC)

The Best Business Idea Competition (BBIC) is a yearly business competition for A' level high school students in the selected schools across Rwanda. The competition is organized by School Entrepreneurship Network (SEN Rwanda) with the aim to celebrate high school students with brilliant business ideas, motivate them and guide them as they start their businesses. Winners receive competitive prizes that include cash prizes, tickets and scholarships for advanced training in entrepreneurship, and connections.





The Organizer...

School Entrepreneurship Network (SEN)

School Entrepreneurship Network is a project of The Mugenzi Trust's Center for Youth Entrepreneurship working with Rwandan high schools in the domain of entrepreneurship education.

The project's core task of SEN is to encourage students and support teachers to create and sustain entrepreneurship clubs in Rwandan high schools. The core values that guide all SEN's work are working with and strengthening existing resources (e.g. teachers, curriculum, and initiatives). SEN's long-term vision is to install a flourishing entrepreneurship club in every Rwandan high school by 2020.

With experience and success stories since it started in 2011, SEN Rwanda is currently the only fully local project that offers high school students an integrated and comprehensive entrepreneurship experience.

The core activities of SEN are currently:

- Entrepreneurship Clubs Program: Starting and supporting high school based entrepreneurship clubs countrywide
- *Entrepreneurship Competitions Program*: Organizing entrepreneurship competitions (business idea and business plan challenges), to celebrate and connect students with out-standing ideas.
- Training Program: Providing training to the entrepreneurship clubs, teachers and students with best business idea
- "Entrepreneurship Plus" Program: Enabling an entrepreneurship friendly environment in high schools (This is achieved through 3 sub-programs: Entrepreneurship Read!, Entrepreneurship Talk!, and Entrepreneurship Relax!").

Our purpose is to offer high school youth an opportunity to fully develop an entrepreneurial mindset. We wish that every high student graduate from high school with business skills and tools (e.g. business idea, business plan, etc), and a sense of self-employment

The work of SEN is in direct response to the current problem of high unemployment of high school graduates, the majority of whom do not access tertiary education.



BBIC 2011 (First Edition) – Flash back

The First Edition - BBIC 2011

The first edition of SEN Best Business Idea Competition (BBIC) was organized in September 2011 as the first pilot project of the organization.

The following four schools were selected to represent the 4 provinces of Rwanda excluding Kigali City:

- GS Frank Adamson (Western Province)
- G.S Rilima (Eastern Province)
- ESAPAG Gitwe (Southern Province)
- G.S APAPEC Murambi (Northern Province).

The competition recorded a total of 39 entries that were judged by 4 international judges. Winners were awarded with cash prizes and various prizes on November 17, 2011 at Umubano Hotel during the Graduation Ceremony of the 4 cohort of the Rwanda Business Development Center (BDC Rwanda), the institution which also offered a scholarship to the first winner to attend its 16-week professional training in entrepreneurship.





The 2012 Best Business Idea Competition

The Organization of the Competition

School Entrepreneurship Network (SEN) organized the second edition of its Best Business Idea Competition as a big challenge to which 50 high schools across Rwanda were invited. Every province or Kigali City was represented by 10 high schools.

Best business ideas to be awarded were screened at both provincial and national levels. This competition started on September 7, 2012 with entries being submitted until September 28, 2012.

Students from 31 schools submitted 300+ ideas which were judged by experienced high school entrepreneurship teachers. The competition results were announced on November 3rd, 2012 with the awarding ceremony being scheduled on November 30, 2012
